Adult Checklist - British Dyslexia Association

Score less than 45 - probably non-dyslexic Research results: no individual who was diagnosed as dyslexic through a full assessment was found to have scored less than 45 and therefore it is unlikely that if you score under 45 you will be dyslexic Score 45 to 60 - showing signs consistent with mild dyslexia
