skills refer to knowing how to act (reactions, attitudes to adopt) and "ethical" skills refer to professional ethics, bioethical values that guide actions and clinical judgment Developing all of these skills is very important for the nursing profession and both nurses and patients benefit from it

Communication and Empathy in the Patient-Centered Care ...

Skills can be broken down into three domains: (a) technical, (b) cognitive, and (c) behavioral More traditional strategies such as lectures, screen-based tutorials, and limited workshops may assist in the cognitive domain with initial knowledge acquisition and self-assessment but have less effect

Learning-to-learn skills Second, if we think about development as fitting into neat domain-based divisions, we lose sight of the crucial learning-to-learn skills that cut across domain boundaries (Golinkoff & Hirsh-Pasek, 2016) Truly learning information and new skills requires a dynamic, deep, conceptual understanding that often relies upon
